Study Methodology


- Conducted by Greenwald Research.
- Information was collected from online interviews between October 10-25, 2023.
- A total of 1,208 individuals aged 25 and older completed the survey.
- The final data were weighted by age, gender, and income to reflect the demographics of Americans aged 25 and older.



More than three-fourths of Americans think these programs are a good idea.

Figure 2: 77% of Americans Agree State Facilitated Programs Are A Good Idea.


Overall, do you think these state retirement programs are a...

Figure 3: Across Party Lines, American Agree That State-Facilitated Retirement Programs Are A Good Idea.


Overall, do you think these state retirement programs are a...

Figure 4: Across Generations, Americans Agree That State-Facilitated Retirement Programs Are A Good Idea.







Figure 7: Across Generations, Most Americans Would Participate In State-Facilitated Retirement Programs.
